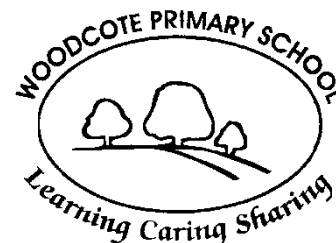


Sports Funding 2021 / 22

This year we received a total of £17,530 in our Department for Education PE and Sport Funding allocation, which we have used to directly improve the quality of sport and PE for all children.



We still carry forward £13,854 from last year's funding accrued during the preceding Covid Lockdown period, making a total this year of £31,792.

Overall Impact from Funding:

- Some sporting opportunities were delayed or cancelled in the first term due to Covid restrictions still in place. However, Woodcote Primary School went to everything they were offered in order to keep PE and sport high on the priority list.
- We have purchased more equipment for the teaching of PE and outdoor games
- School's own swimming instructors and lifeguards to support swimming lessons
- The offer of swimming lessons for KS2 children from an early age and continued provision to revisit the swimming curriculum for those who need it.
- 100% of year 6 children can swim confidently, competently and consistently over more than one stroke and can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
- Sports clubs are back as an offer of an active hour for the children and childcare for parents.
- We have danced in so many different styles with our regular sports coach and also with Urban Strides teaching us Street Dance. Inspiring visitors – both of whom are male – good role models!
- The new and enhanced Trim Trail is installed and available for all children to use. It enhances balance, strength, challenge and teamwork.

Intentions for 2022/23

We intend to continue with the above, and increase back to our usual, pre-Covid, high standard,

- Continue to provide the enhanced provision of Swimming lessons from year 2 - 6 in order that everyone meets the standard by the time they leave school
- Training for teachers across the PE curriculum, where observation and moderation shows requirement
- Continued offer of before and after school inclusive sports clubs
- Achieve the Gold Kite Mark again, now the award is made available post Covid.
- Become a hub school for partnership offers of competitive and collaborative sports
- Make use of good quality Sports Coaches to enhance the school offer to all
- Workshops in different dance genres from around the world to experience cultural differences and experience ways of moving.
