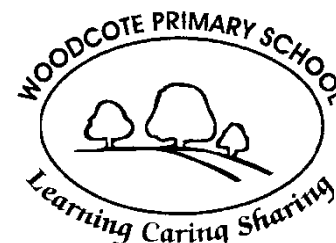


## Sports Funding

From September 2015 to August 2016 the government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/sport. We received a total of £8,808. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will be used to directly improve the quality of sport and PE for all children.

At Woodcote Primary School we received £8808 for the year 2015/2016.

### Impact from Funding:

- Increased number of sporting opportunities across the Partnership
- Increased organised sports and playtime games from pupils for pupils
- More equipment for the teaching of PE
- School's own swimming instructors and lifeguards to support swimming lessons
- The offer of swimming lessons for all children from age 5 right through to age 11.
- All children who left in year 6 were able to swim at least the minimum requirement of 25 meters
- The school was awarded the Silver Sainsbury's Kite Mark
