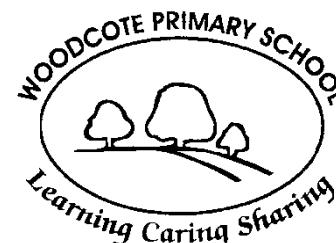


## Sports Funding

From September 2014 to August 2015 the government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/sport. We received a total of £8,845. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will be used to directly improve the quality of sport and PE for all children.
