



Sports Funding

From September 2013 the government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/sport. Each school will receive £8, 000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

How the impact will be measured:

1. Increased skill, confidence and understanding of swimming and water safety, as well as other sports;
2. Equipment will be used more effectively – observations;
3. Increased enjoyment of PE lessons (evidenced through pupil evaluations);
4. Increased participation in PE and sport, in school and out of school.
