

Sports Funding 2024 / 25

This year we received a total of £17,460 in our Department for Education PE and Sport Funding allocation, which we have used to directly improve the quality of sport and PE for all children.

Overall Impact from Funding:

- Woodcote Primary School went to almost everything they were offered from the Partnership and also from South Oxfordshire Schools, promoting the importance of sport and PE.
- We have purchased more equipment for the teaching of PE and outdoor games
- School's own Swim England instructors and lifeguards provide high quality swimming lessons
- We offer swimming lessons for KS2 children from an early age and continued provision to revisit the swimming curriculum for those who need it ensuring everyone gets their 25m (or as close as possible) before they leave the school.
- Year 6 children leave being able to swim confidently, competently and consistently over more than one stroke and can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
- Sports clubs offer of an active time for the children in conjunction with childcare support for parents.
- We achieved a kite mark this year.

- We provided the partnership cluster of schools with the opportunity for a competitive swimming gala.

Intentions for 2025/26

We intend to continue with the above, maintaining our high standard and large range of opportunities.

- Continue to provide the enhanced provision of Swimming lessons from year 3 - 6 in order that everyone meets the required standard by the time they leave school.
- Training for teachers across the PE curriculum, where observation and moderation shows requirement
- Continued offer of before and after school inclusive sports clubs.
- Achieve the Gold Kite Mark by end of July 2025.
- Promote competitive Swimming opportunities for the whole parentship of schools.
- Make use of good quality Sports Coaches to enhance the school offer to all.
- Workshops in different dance genres and different styles from home and around the world to experience cultural differences and experience ways of moving to music.
