



## Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been *looked after* continuously for more than six months.

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for FSM and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

A premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

### 2013/14

At Woodcote Primary School we received £18300 for the year 2013/2014.

#### Provision

Each pupil's needs are individually assessed. The provision is then developed to address their specific needs or the needs of a group of pupils with similar requirements, through discussion by the Headteacher, SENCo and teacher. The provision consists of:

- Access to our Home-School Link worker to improve social and emotional learning which will have a direct impact on their attainment. The H-S Link Worker also works with engaging parents with their child's education and improving attendance.
- One-to-one and group literacy and mathematics interventions.
- Extra TA support for 3 days a week to help pupils with literacy and maths.
- Providing 10 sessions of 1-1 tutoring for an hour each week (focusing on grammar, punctuation and spelling) for some children in Key Stage Two.

#### Impact

Pupil's confidence has improved and their progress is good.

Average points of progress of pupils eligible for pupil premium, measured from July 2013 to January 2014 (good progress over one term is 1.3 points or higher):

## **2012/2013**

### **Support**

An extra TA in the mornings to support a particular class with pupils eligible for pupil premium.

One-to-one reading, literacy interventions and maths group interventions.

### **Impact**

*Standards at the end of Key Stage Two*

100% of pupils eligible for pupil premium achieved level 4 in Mathematics, Reading and Writing. They all achieved expected progress in those subjects.
